















Vocabulary

Characteristics	A distinguishing trait, feature or quality.
Environment	The conditions in which a living thing exists.
Fossil	Naturally preserved remains or traces of animals or plants that lived long ago.
Inherited	The way a trait or characteristic is passed to offspring from parents.
Mutation	A mistake or a change in a living things DNA.
Species	A group of closely related organisms that are similar to each other.
Variation	A change or small difference.

polar bear 	arctic 	Its white fur enables it to camouflage in the snow.
camel 	desert 	It has wide feet to make it easier to walk in the sand.
cactus 	desert 	It stores water in its stem.
toucan 	rainforest 	Its narrow tongue allows it to eat small fruit and insects.

War	Any prolonged conflict between rival political groups by force of arms
Armour	Body armour is special protective clothing that people such as soldiers and police officers sometimes wear when they are in danger of being attacked.
Civil War	A war between citizens of the same country.
Medieval Period	A period in the history of Europe which lasted from the 5 th to the 15 th centuries.
Century	A period of 100 years.
Cause and Effect	A cause-effect relationship is one in which a certain event (the cause) makes another event happen
Secondary Sources	A secondary source does not give original information. It interprets or summarizes information from primary sources.
Cavalry	Soldiers who fought on horseback.
Infantry	Soldiers marching or fighting on foot.
Primary Sources	A primary source is a work that gives original information. It is something that comes from a time being studied or from a person who was involved in the events being studied.
